Festivals are not just about fun; they teach children culture, values, joy, and unity.

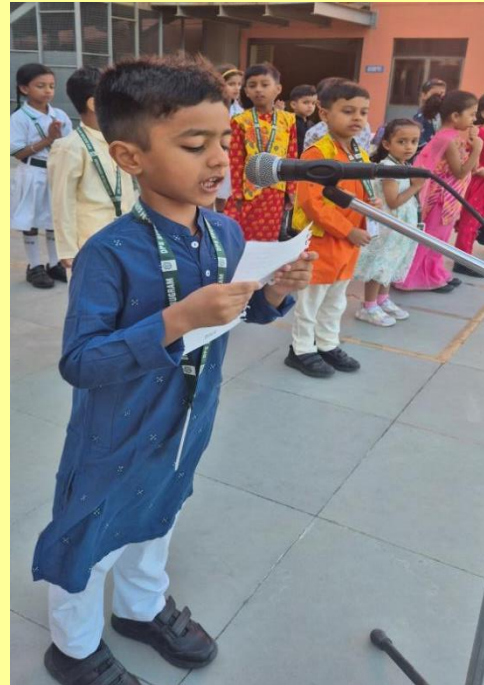
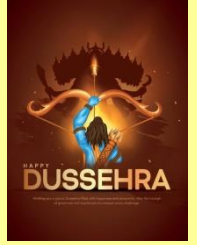

The celebration ended on a heartwarming note as children shared and enjoyed food together, embracing the values of kindness, sharing, and togetherness.



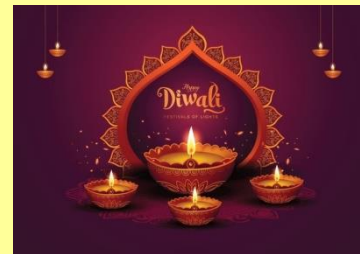
